Broward Health, providing service since 1938, is a nonprofit community health system offering a full spectrum of healthcare services. Facilities include four hospitals: Broward Health Medical Center, Broward Health North, Broward Health Imperial Point, and Broward Health Coral Springs. It is a medical safety net for Broward County residents. These four medical centers anchor Broward Health services that include primary healthcare centers, home health services and hospice, family health places, physician practices, specialty care services and extensive community services and programming.



As the cornerstone of healthcare in northern Broward County, Broward Health is an organization committed to meeting the healthcare needs of all citizens. It provides a complete continuum of healthcare services, from wellness and prevention programs to treatment and rehabilitation, home health, and follow-up care. This is accomplished through the availability of progressive specialty care services, advanced technology and equipment, a highly skilled and trained medical staff and professional personnel, and the guidance of a dedicated administrative staff and Board of Commissioners.

CLINICAL SITE INFORMATION

Founded in 1938, the 716-bed Broward Health Medical Center is the county's oldest, largest, and most complete referral medical center. It annually admits 25,000 patients, delivers 3,000 babies and handles more than 100,000 emergencies.

Broward Health's medical firsts include Cardiac Catheterization, Neonatal Intensive Care and full-time physician staffing in the emergency department. Accreditation's include Broward County's first sleep laboratory accredited by the American Sleep Disorders Association as well the first cancer program approved by the American College of Surgeons in Broward County.

SPECIALIZED SERVICES

Broward Health Pediatric Services offers a full range of pediatric services. Complete pediatric services include a pediatric unit, pediatric emergency department, Level I pediatric trauma center, pediatric and neonatal transport team, pediatric intensive care unit, child life services, pediatric surgery, anesthesia and radiology services, pediatric rehabilitation services, pediatric speech therapy, pediatric oncology/hematology services and pediatric hospice.

The Lillian S. Wells Women's Health Center services include state-of-the-art New Generations Birthing Suites, regional perinatal intensive care, neonatal intensive care unit, childbirth education, prenatal care center, a lactation center and the Comprehensive Breast Center.

The Comprehensive Cancer Center is an approved program by the Commission on Cancer of the American College of Surgeons. Services include prevention, state-of-the-art detection, diagnosis, treatment and on-going follow-up. Our services are supported by multiple programs and coordinated by a specially trained multi-disciplinary team.

The Heart Center of Excellence provides advanced techniques in diagnosis, cardiac catheterization, surgery and intensive care. The Cardiac Rehabilitation and Wellness Center Programs facilitate outpatient services for this patient population.

The Stroke Care Excellence combines state-of-the-art technology with an experienced team of stroke specialists to ensure patients receive a higher level of care.

LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS

PharmD degree with Florida licensure. Licensure must be obtained within the first 90 days of the program.

BENEFITS*

The resident receives (through pre-tax payroll deductions) health insurance with optional dental and optical plans, fifteen (15) sick/vacation days, two (2) professional days for board certifications with additional conference days as determined by program director, paid orientation, discounted meals, and professional travel reimbursement. Parking is provided for free to the resident.

STIPEND*

- Salary: \$52,757 per year
- Meal stipend: \$25 per day
- Conference funds: \$2,000 to cover mandatory conference travel costs (resident will continue getting paid regular salary during conferences)

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Broward Health Medical Center residents will participate in distributive as well as clinical pharmacy functions. As a member of the multidisciplinary team, residents will experience a wide variety of practice environments. Residents may choose from a large selection of electives. The various facilities throughout Broward Health provide excellent exposure for candidates in many areas of specialized medicine. There are opportunities to expand and enhance knowledge base via training with an emphasis in acute care, ambulatory care, or pediatric care. Longitudinal experiences focusing on patient safety, administration, ambulatory clinic experience, and academia are integrated into the program. The candidate will also have the opportunity to precept PharmD students throughout the year. Residents are required to complete an individual clinical research project, which is presented at a state and national conference.

DEADLINE for submission of all materials to PhORCAS is January 1st.


Applicants must submit the following to *PhORCAS* by the deadline:

- 1. A brief letter of intent that includes the resident's goals and objectives for completion of our ASHP accredited program as well as any other relevant information the resident wishes to be evaluated during the consideration process.
- 2. An updated Curriculum Vitae

following steps outline the application process.

- 3. Provide three letters of recommendation completed online through PhORCAS. The recommendation should focus on why the applicant should be considered for the residency program.
- 4. An official transcript from the college(s) of pharmacy where the candidate is expected to graduate or did graduate.
- 5. After receipt of all the required materials, selected applicants will be contacted for an onsite interview.
- 6. The applicant will be required to give a 10-15 minute presentation on a clinical topic of choice.
